English:	
Phonics - revise	<p>Mr Mc Day 8 'ear' words https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IY1QnQ5oA4c</p> <p>Parents there is an activity at the end that needs an adult to help write the letters out on pieces of paper so the children can choose them to make words.</p>
Reading:	<p>Write 'ear' words on pieces of paper or card and hide around the house/outside - can they find them and read them? Orally put them into a sentence? (ear, hear, year, fear, beard, near, spear, gear)</p>
Reading:	<p>Oxford Reading Owls</p> <p>This is a great website and is currently free to use. It takes a little navigating to get to the reading books but please have a go. Let me know if you have any difficulties. I will also post the details on Tapestry.</p> <p>Go to the Oxford Reading Owls website.</p> <p>You will need to register but this is currently free.</p> <p>Look for e-books on the tabs at the top and click on it.</p> <p>Look for e-book library quite near the top and click on the arrow.</p> <p>Scroll down until you see four headings one of which is Levels.</p> <p>On the dropdown menu click on Book Band.</p> <p>Select the colour that your child is on and hopefully a range of books will appear that you can read!</p> <p>If the level is too easy or your child would like a challenge - try the next level.</p> <p>Have fun exploring! Some of the books have interactive activities the children can do too.</p>
Spellings:	<p>you, they, all</p> <p>If your child is unsure of how to write them, please write the word out for them, show them it, count to 10 then hide it behind your back, can they then write it? Show them the word again to check if they have got it right. If not, let them just copy the word by looking at it and try again later/tomorrow. This is known as Look, Cover, Write, Check. (LCWC)</p>

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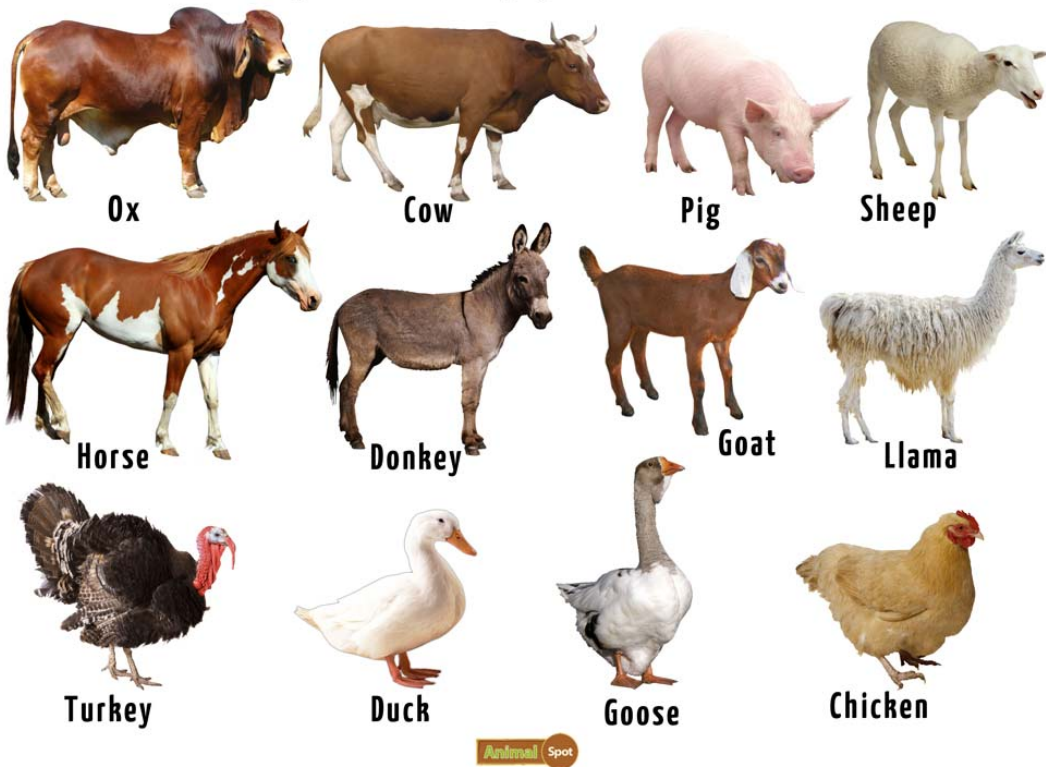
